#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today, as we enter the Church New Year and the season of Advent, we are invited to prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

We are not getting ready to indulge in an orgy of 'excess' in all sorts of things. If we stuff and clutter our lives, we leave no space for Jesus to enter into our lives. The biblical story of 'no room at the inn' is not all about an event in the past; it is about our lives now.

Is there room in our life for prayer? Is there room in our life for spending time with someone who is lonely? Is there freedom in our life to be a giving type of person, and not a grasping egotist?

During the four weeks of Advent, we are not called to a 'passive waiting' like we do when we are stuck in a traffic jam, or waiting for the bus. The Spirit of God calls us to an 'active waiting'. We should be like parents expecting the birth of a new baby, who are focussed on all sorts of practical tasks, in anticipation of the happy event. Antenatal exercises, purchasing cot and buggy are just a few of the energy demanding things that are done with joyful hope.

Everything we can do to alleviate misery and suffering, assists in creating a world where no one should feel that there is no room at the inn.

We look back to the first Christmas in order to look forward to a better future. Through faith and prayer we nourish a vision of what is 'not yet', that empowers us to change ourselves and our world.

One of the names we give Jesus is *Emmanuel*, and that word means 'God is with us'. And yes, it is true; He is.


